An extract from the Association's Memorandum & Articles of Association

- 13(A) Any Ordinary Member may withdraw from the Association by giving notice in writing duly signed to the Secretary at least six months before** the expiration of any financial year, and on paying with such notice any unpaid subscription for the current year and also for each and any subsequent year which such member shall have guaranteed to subscribe on election, and thereupon such Member shall be deemed to have ceased to be a Member from the date of the expiration of such financial year. In default of such notice being so given, an Ordinary Member shall be liable to pay the subscription for the ensuing year and in cases where any undertaking or guarantee has been given for subscriptions or donations for any given number of years the Member shall continue to be liable there under.
- (B) Any member other than an Ordinary Member may withdraw from the Association by giving notice in writing to the Secretary at any time and paying with such notice any unpaid subscriptions that may be due and also subscriptions for subsequent years and donations agreed upon or guaranteed by such Member on election (if any) and thereupon shall cease to be a Member.
- (C) Upon the retirement of any Member by notice as stated in Articles 13(A) and (B) the Member shall not be entitled under any conditions to any repayment of any subscription or any part thereof whether paid for the current year or for a year or years in advance.
- 14(A) The Council may recommend to the Directors the removal of a Member of the Association pursuant to a Resolution of the Council for the removal of the Member passed by a majority of at least three-fourths of the Members present and voting at Special Council meeting of which not less than twenty-one days previous notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution shall have been sent to the Member whose removal is in question and to all the Members of the Council. Notice of the general nature of the grounds on which such resolution is proposed shall be sent to the Member whose removal is in question at least fourteen days before the meeting, and he shall be entitled to be heard by the Council at the meeting. On a Member being removed, the due proportion of such Member's current subscription shall be returned having regard to the unexpired period for which it is paid, provided that a Member who has been appointed by the Department to be a Member of the Council, shall not be removed by the Council pursuant to this Article without previous consultation with the Department.
- (B) The Directors are empowered to remove any Member from membership of the Association. If the removal of a member is effected by the Directors other than pursuant to a recommendation of the Council, the Member shall be entitled to be heard by the Council at a special meeting convened in accordance with the requirements of Article 14(A)
